## What is the Project's Path?

The UCPath Project team has strategically implemented and rigorously executed the following plans to support Go-Live. Berkeley's Project Activities include:

- Data Clean Up To reduce errors in data conversion
- Multiple Rounds of Testing Executed over 45 testing sessions with Subject
  Matter Experts across campus
- **Required User Training** Supporting and training a team of trainers to ensure all users have access to the required training sessions. And tracking completion of all required training for operational staff
- **PeopleSoft Familiarity** Berkeley has the advantage of experience we use Human Capital Management (HCM), which is the basis for UCPath
- **Operational Alignment** Berkeley has 40+ meetings with dedicated UCPath Center staff prior to Go-Live to ensure integration with UCPath Center operations
- Planned Partnerships The project team has developed partnerships with Central Human Resources, Controller's office, CSS, and APO to develop new and meaningful E2E Business Process
